Through their ongoing involvement in the School Enterprise Challenge, Kariba South Primary School has established and grown a successful tailoring business, making school uniforms, bags and aprons. The students have generated an impressive profit by using second-hand materials and through finding new markets for their products both in Zambia and the UK! They have also recently expanded their product range into fabric Christmas decorations, which have proved really popular! 100% of the profits from this successful business have been reinvested back into the school, which has enabled them to purchase bricks for a girls latrine block and a house for their teacher! The business team of 20 students have developed valuable practical skills in product design, cutting patterns and sewing, as well as experience in business planning, record keeping and finances.
