AT A GLANCE

Our journey began in 2016, inspired by Mahatma Gandhi's Nai Talim—a philosophy that emphasises learning through hands-on experience, self-reliance, and community service. We aimed to create a new model of education that not only teaches but empowers.

We brought this vision to life with the opening of Akshar Forum, our model school in Assam. This school was established to serve children from some of the most underprivileged backgrounds, many of whom were forced to prioritise survival over education, working in hazardous conditions rather than attending school. We strive to transform these children's lives by providing them with an education that is practical, sustainable, and rooted in community values, helping them to break free from the cycle of poverty.

THE RISING CONCERN

The ASER Report 2022 reveals a rising concern regarding foundational literacy and numeracy in Indian government schools. The data shows that around 75% of Class V students cannot read basic English sentences. In mathematics, 78.4% of Class V, 72.6% of Class VI, 66% of Class VII, and 58.2% of Class VIII students lack fundamental division skills.

The Need for Foundational Literacy & Numeracy (FLN): These troubling statistics highlight the urgent need for interventions across upper primary and middle school grades to ensure foundational literacy and numeracy are established throughout the elementary stage.










CHALLENGES



Over the years, we've faced several challenges, particularly in ensuring that students have access to earning models that prevent them and their families from prioritizing immediate survival over education.

SOLUTIONS



Our innovative "Learning and Earning" model allows students to earn while they learn. At Akshar Forum, students pay their fees with plastic waste, which is recycled into usable products—a step towards a cleaner environment. Older students tutor younger ones, care for pets, and participate in various school responsibilities to earn. We teach financial management by creating dummy bank accounts for students to manage under our guidance, helping them understand the value of money and plan for their future efficiently. Beyond academics, students engage in practical activities like carpentry, electronics repair, organic farming, and more, ensuring that learning is both real-world and holistic, nurturing mind, body, and soul.
















FROM LOCAL ROOTS TO WORLDWIDE RECOGNITION
