Valentine's day is fast approaching and love is in the air, or apparently not if you live in a flatshare across the UK. **A new survey by [Easyroommate](#)**, the world's largest flatshare community, has revealed that after surveying 1000 of its users, **only 11% of people have been in a relationship with their flatmates**. Though it's clear dating your flatmate in the UK isn't popular, the survey did show that **a much higher percentage (32%) admitted to having a crush on one of their flatmates or would consider dating one**.

The data also showed that **flatsharers in Leeds are most likely to find love** with 27% of people admitting to have dated their flatmate, **followed by flatsharers in London (14%)**. However, people living in flatshares in Manchester or Birmingham almost completely rule out the idea with **97% of Manchester and 96% of Birmingham flatsharers voting against dating their flatmate**.
