- Exercise-related search terms such as **running, workouts and yoga** have spiked as we come to terms with closed gyms and a desire to make the most of our permitted daily outdoor exercise. Motivating many more than a January 1st New Years resolution.
- When we're not working up a sweat we're working out our brains and stomachs, with **reading and baking** search terms skyrocketing as we try to entertain ourselves.
- Despite the unprecedented times we find ourselves in, searches for **mental health-related terms such as anxiety, depression and stress** have remained broadly flat.
- We're all showing our altruistic side as a nation, with searches for **donations**, including donations to the centenarian fundraiser Tom Moore, spiking as we all look to play our part.
