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Not an illness or disease, tinnitus is a term that describes the sensation of hearing a noise in the absence of an external sound. The noise can have virtually any quality. Ringing, whistling, and buzzing are common, but more complex sounds may also be reported. Troublesome tinnitus can be very distressing for the affected individual, and issues may arise with sleep, concentration and mood. However, in many cases, subtle changes in people's environment can address these issues, and improve quality of life.

## About EarDial

EarDial was 228% funded in Kickstarter by October 2016 and started shipping on January 2017. It is mainly sold via Amazon in Europe and North America. EarDial was tested and certified by one of the best laboratories in Germany under the EN and ANSI standards. It provides a flat attenuation that doesn't distort sound. This are some of the things that make them special:

- **High fidelity, precise noise filtration:** Hear the music and chat with your friends while protecting yourself from harmful sound decibels.
- **Low-profile design, high transparency:** Almost invisible when you put them in your ears, no matter your skin colour.
- **Soft hypoallergenic silicone:** Wear them comfortably for long hours, even for the most sensitive, with exclusive earwax protection.
- **Compact aluminium case:** Easy to store, take out, and carry around at all times. Optional luminescent sticker to find in the dark included.
- **Companion mobile app:** Know the sound level around you, and how long you can stay safely.

EarDial is perfect for music-lovers, party-goers, DJs, musicians (playing guitar, bass, drums, singers, etc.), bartenders, bouncers, and anyone that wants to hear clearly and safely in a loud music event, like concerts, studios, nightclubs and festivals. It's also perfect for other loud social events, like sport events, or cinemas.
