Responding to **Feeding Britain**, the report of the All-Party Parliamentary Inquiry into Hunger in the UK, due to be published on Monday 8 December, Matthew Reed, Chief Executive of The Children's Society, said:

"Families are facing a quadruple whammy of depressed wages, a malfunctioning benefits system, cuts to state support and unaffordable bills for energy, food and housing. It's a national scandal that ever more families are resorting to food banks to feed their children and it's imperative that this report's call for action is answered.

"Problem debt is a key reason why families seek support from food banks, so urgent steps must be taken to provide families who are struggling to make ends meet with an alternative to payday loans. All families in poverty must be able to access free school meals and receive help with heating their homes. And the Government must withdraw its threat to scrap national funding for Local Welfare Assistance schemes, which help thousands of the most desperate families cope with crises."
