Information on Humanitas

We are a young, creative, grassroots charity that has worked for more than a decade to protect and care for some of the world's most vulnerable children. We run medical, educational and foster care projects in Romania and Africa and more recently we have sent medical teams to deliver urgent treatment to refugees living in the European border camps.

In Romania

Our work in Romania is focused on the rehabilitation of children who have been orphaned or abandoned, many of whom have disabilities. We run two residential homes for up to sixteen children who are cared for by foster parents, with support from a physiotherapist, doctor and social worker. Many of the children living in our homes have experienced severe neglect whilst living in state run institutions and need intense therapy and emotional support to enable them to overcome their experiences and move on with their lives. We have seen the children in our care grow from frightened, mute and undernourished children into teenagers that are thriving, learning and attending mainstream school. We also run a foster care programme in Romania and currently have eighteen children placed with loving families in their homes.

In Ghana

Our work in Ghana is focused on the education of children living in the remote village of Azyensuako where the farming community lives well below the poverty line. The families are unable to afford the cost of sending their children to the state run schools located many miles from the village. In 2014 we established a primary school, which now teaches 160 children living in the village and the surrounding area. We believe that education opens up opportunities that could not be considered otherwise – further study and future employment in the towns and cities. Our pupils have the potential to break the cycle of poverty in their communities and attending school is just the start to setting all of this in motion.

Our work with refugees

The existing refugee medical tents are all located in the registered camps but there are still thousands of refugees who are forced to wait for weeks on the European borders because the camps are full. We have taken the Humanitas mobile medical clinic, our doctor and qualified nursing volunteers on several missions to Greece, Serbia and Croatia to treat refugee children and their families living in unregistered camps where there is no access to medical aid. We strongly believe that people fleeing war and

persecution deserve to be treated with dignity and respect and our mobile clinic allows us to care for patients in a well-lit, dry and private space in an otherwise desperate environment that lacks basic humanity.
