Ed Fletcher, HOPE Business Development Manager, said, "It's not every day a charity founded just 20 years ago on a £5,000 legacy gets asked to become a part of an international campaign. Even less often do they get asked to become a founding partner! However, this is exactly what has happened to HOPE, and we couldn't be more excited to become part of the #GivingTuesday UK campaign.
