

Government contributes £245,000 to Localgiving's Grow Your Tenner match fund campaign

- The Office for Civil Society has injected £245,000 into Localgiving's 'Grow Your Tenner' match fund to help local charities and community groups become more sustainable.
- · Localgiving is seeking more match funding ahead of the campaign's launch on 18 October.
- Local charities and community groups are encouraged to join the campaign with free memberships available for all those attending Localgiving's training webinars.
- Up to £2,500 of match funding will be available for each participating local charity or community group, matching public donations.

The Office for Civil Society has announced its support for <u>Grow Your Tenner</u>, an online match fund campaign run by <u>Localgiving</u> that supports local charities and community groups in the UK. OCS is contributing £245,000 to the pot, bringing the current total amount of match funding available to £345,000.

Grow Your Tenner 2016 will run from 10am on Tuesday the 18th October until the match fund runs out, or 5pm on Thursday the 17th November - whichever comes first. During the campaign one time donations made to local charities via Localgiving will be matched by up to £10; as will Direct Debits by up to £10 a month for the first 3 months.

This is why Localgiving is calling on donors to get involved and help increase the size of the match fund pot even further before the campaign launches on 18th October, so that as many local charities and community groups can benefit as possible. You can contribute to the appeal here.

Charities and community groups operating locally within the UK are eligible to benefit from the scheme. **Each group will have the chance to secure up to £2,500 of match funding**: £1,000 from one time donations and £1,500 from Direct Debits. To take part, groups must have an active Localgiving membership. Any organisations wishing to join Localgiving can do so here.

The additional funding forms part of government's commitment to help local charities and community groups to become more resilient and sustainable. As part of those plans, government will hold a Local Charities Day later this year to celebrate the contributions of these groups to communities across the country. OCS will back a smaller match funding campaign delivered by Localgiving as part of those celebrations.

In the lead up to the campaign launch, **Localgiving is running a series of free webinars** to deliver skills training and build fundraising capacity amongst local charities. All webinar attendees will also have the opportunity to **claim a free first year Localgiving membership**, worth £72. The next webinar will run on Tuesday the 4th of October at 1pm.

Minister for Civil Society, Rob Wilson, said:

"The energy, commitment and expertise of local charities and community groups make a huge difference to the lives of countless people around the country.

This is why we have added funds to this excellent campaign and will host a 'Local Charities Day' later in the year to celebrate and strengthen the invaluable work they do.

I encourage other donors to follow government's lead, add to this fund and help local charities get the support they need now and in the long term, helping us build a compassionate Britain that works for everyone."

"Match funds have proved time and again to be highly effective at helping grassroots organisations to fundraise, so we are thrilled that OCS is backing this year's Grow Your Tenner campaign to increase the amount of match funding available.
