Featuring 110 seats and a painstakingly restored 1948 1100 "Flukebox", the atmosphere is a captivating and lively blend of timeless style and London eccentricity. With British farmed potatoes, fresh fish delivered daily from Billingsgate, ales from the Camden Brewery, Nude Coffee from Brick Lane, sausages from the Ginger Pig in Marylebone, and locally baked bread rolls, Poppies offers perfect grub for those breaming of something authentically British.

What's more, every Fryday and Saturday the restaurant transforms into a dynamic venue for live music, inviting you to tuna up and indulge your soleful side with a range of acts bringing you the best of British rock n roll, funk, blues, jazz and jive to tap your feet to while you munch away and indulge your nostalgic side. 
## October
