

Hyperoptic adds four new hyper-cities and doubles footprint in six months

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- Newcastle, Sheffield, Birmingham and Nottingham join Glasgow as the latest hyper-cities to get fastest consumer broadband in the UK
- · Hyperoptic will soon reach more than 75,000 homes, spanning 480 sites

06 October 2014, London, UK: Gigabit broadband is speeding its way across the UK as <u>Hyperoptic</u>, the UK's leading Fibre-to-the-Home provider, announces that it has added four new cities to its hyper-cities club, taking the total to 12 cities in the UK, where consumers have access to the lightening-fast symmetrical gigabit (1,000Mbps) broadband speeds.

Hyperoptic will soon reach more than 75,000 homes spanning 480 sites, with a target of half a million homes by 2018. This rapid increase is largely due to a huge rise in demand from Brits, who have taken control over their need for speed at home and <u>registered their interest</u> via the Hyperoptic website. The growth of Hyperoptic has been further accelerated by an ever-increasing group of hyper-champions, residents who campaign for gigabit speeds within their development.

In London, Hyperoptic's gigabit footprint now extends across the length and breadth of the city; from central riverside apartments, all the way to the developments situated near the M25. The service is also live in Cardiff and Bristol, and installations are underway in Manchester, Liverpool, Leeds and Reading.

The latest cities are Newcastle, Sheffield, Birmingham and Nottingham – which join the recently announced hyper-city, Glasgow. All cities were chosen by demand and number of residential developments.
