Onclick create innovative treatment and assessment tool, **The Maudsley Care Pathways** - an easy to use online care pathway providing an up to date and interactive knowledge base for health professionals, service users and carers.

The Maudsley Care Pathways focuses on the mental health of older adults, specifically five disorders, Dementia, Depression, Personality Disorder, Psychosis and Anxiety. The evidence

based interactive tool is simple to use and responsively designed to be accessed via desktop, tablet or mobile device.

Working in collaboration with South London and Maudsley NHS Foundation Trust and Kings Health Partners, Onclick project-led and developed the Maudsley Care Pathways.

"The launch of this application signals the culmination of the work of around 60 of our leading mental health experts, working together to provide a digital solution to help patients manage their condition, it's a staggering piece of work that will be of real benefit to our service users and clinicians and help them manage their care in the digital age like never before."

The Maudsley Care Pathways tool describes the journey a person will take once a diagnosis has been made and the anticipated care provided for by South London and Maudsley (SLaM) NHS Foundation Trust Services. A multi-disciplinary team of nurses, doctors, consultants and service users has agreed the evidence driven content.

How does it work?

The user simply selects the disorder that has been recognised or diagnosed, chooses the type of disorder, and if appropriate, the severity of the condition. Through intelligent filtering, they will then be presented with a selection of relevant treatments.

In order to ensure that the treatment and care SLaM provides is effective, a range of outcome tools are used to help assess the severity of a condition and monitor change. Within the

Outcomes page, you can navigate through the different tools practitioners use for selected diagnosis.

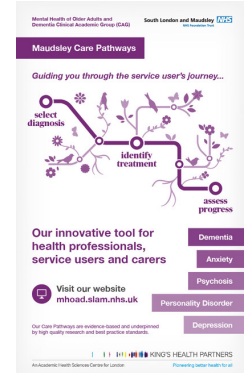
Based on the results of any assessments, users can then review diagnosis, by selecting a new disorder from the homepage, or choose ready for discharge.
