A key feature of the Plantfoil roof system is the Resysta guttering. Resysta is manufactured from a combination of waste rice husk, common salt, and mineral oil; this innovative new material is a highly durable and sustainable alternative to timber.

Plantfoil systems using Resysta for their guttering will look as good as the day they were assembled for years to come, as the material is water resistant, does not degrade in sunlight, and will usually only require a single treatment on installation.
