

London offices defy Tube strike disruption: Feedr and CycleSaver data reveal a more resilient, multi-modal workforce

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London's recent Underground strikes caused widespread disruption, but new workplace data suggests the impact on office working was less severe than many feared. Proprietary data from [Feedr](#), a leading workplace meals provider, reveals that more than 8 in 10 office workers (83%) still came into the office and ordered lunch as usual during the strike week - significantly higher than industry expectations. This marks a notable surge in workplace resilience compared to the September 2025 strikes, when just 77% of workers made it to their desks.

With a broad footprint across London's corporate sector, [Feedr](#) uses real-time workplace food order volumes as a reliable proxy for office attendance. The signal is unusually clean: employees only order through [Feedr's Cloud Canteen](#) on days they're physically in the office, so order volumes map directly to who's at their desk. The data shows that while strike days trigger an expected dip, today's offices remain far from empty.

This resilience is being heavily driven by a shift towards multi-modal commuting, as Londoners increasingly turn to active travel alternatives to bypass transport disruptions. [CycleSaver](#), a leading bike-sharing subscription platform, reported a massive 200% increase in applications for smaller subscription minute bundles during the April 2026 tube strike period, indicating that a sizable number of users proactively secured subscriptions in anticipation of the travel disruptions. Furthermore, CycleSaver's net new subscriptions grew by 80% during the strike period compared to the previous month, reflecting a clear surge in demand as commuters sought alternative options to maintain their office routines.

"We expected Tube strikes to hit much harder than they did. What the data actually shows is a city that's learned to flex around disruption - whether that's changing how people commute, adjusting their office days, or shifting their travel times. The workforce is becoming more and more adaptable."

The combined findings reflect a broader shift in how London works, pointing to a growing resilience among the workforce as hybrid working patterns and increased flexibility help businesses adapt more effectively to disruption. Compared to pre-pandemic patterns - when transport strikes frequently led to sharp drops in office attendance - today's hybrid model and flexible transport options are acting as a "shock absorber", heavily reducing the overall impact on businesses.

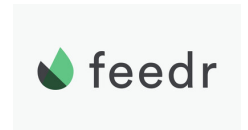
Feedr's data also highlights the crucial role of evolving workplace strategies in maintaining attendance levels. Companies offering enhanced in-office experiences such as high quality office catering, subsidised lunches or cycling initiatives appear to be significantly better positioned to encourage employees into the office, even during periods of transit disruption.

"Employers who invest in the workplace experience are seeing the benefits in moments like this," Fenton added. "When coming into the office feels worthwhile, employees are more willing to navigate the inconvenience."
