About the Cabmen's Shelter Fund

The Cabmen's Shelter Fund was established in 1875 to run shelters for the drivers of hansom cabs and later hackney carriages.

Between 1875 and 1914, 61 cabmen's shelters were constructed. Today, only a few working shelters remain, they are all Grade II listed buildings and they are all still run by the Cabmen's Shelter Fund.

Katie Simmonds has run the cabmen's shelter at Russell Square for the last 5 years.
