- Bentley Motors is the most sought after luxury car brand in the world. 2013 was Bentley's record year in the company's 95-year history. Global customer deliveries grew by 19% over 2012 to 10,120 cars. In 2014 Bentley is on track for another record year. Sales in the first half of the year grew by 23% to 5,254 cars. The Americas remained Bentley's largest sales region, with 1,388 cars delivered. China continued its position as the second biggest market with 1,318 cars, while in Europe, deliveries reached 825 cars. Sales in Bentley's home market, the UK, were 713 and in the Middle East, Bentley delivered 502 cars. At that stage of 2014, Bentley had nearly 200 dealerships in 54 countries.
