The Bangladesh Catering Association (BCA) is calling for its members and the community leaders to lobby at House of Commons on the 10th of July 2018, UK Government to demand a review of its immigration policy.

The Great British curry industry has been suffering since the government's cap on skilled workers was introduced over 10 years ago. When, without due consultation Tier 3 of the then immigration rules was removed.

The BCA responded to this unfair discrimination by organising the largest demonstration on behalf of this in 2008 at Trafalgar Square, The demonstration was attended by over 40,000 people and as a result the Chefs were added to the Shortage Occupation List. However, the criteria and demands set has since put the industry under tremendous pressure and has resulted in the closure of restaurants around the country at an alarming rate of 3-4 per week.

Added to this are the heavy handed raids by UKBA and heavily imposed penalties to the burden levied upon the restaurateurs eager to maintain and survive the current economic climate.

"We urge the government to review and revise their policy as this cap is creating a vacuum in the area of skilled chefs, damaging growth and sustainability of the industry." said Kamal Yakub, President of the BCA

BCA urge the government to review and reverse this policy as the cap is created a vacuum in the area of skilled chefs, that has directly damaged the growth and sustainability of the industry.

Promises made to review the immigration policy following the announcement of Brexit were dashed along with the many promises of re- structure of the immigration rules and criteria for this sector and previous attempts by this and former governments to train chefs within specialized Training Centres of Excellence in the UK have consistently failed to produce the skilled chefs required to address the shortage.
