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# Snowflake Ball Raises over £12,000 for Sick Children's Trust

A Christmas ball – full of glitz and glam – has raised a staggering £12,239 for a charity that provides 'Home from Home' accommodation to the families of sick children being treated at Newcastle upon Tyne's Royal Victoria Infirmary and Freeman Hospital.

The Sick Children's Trust's North East Fundraising Committee hosted their second 'Snowflake Ball' earlier this month at The Newcastle Gateshead Marriot Hotel, Metrocentre, to raise money for the charity's two 'Homes from Home' - Crawford House at the RVI and Scott House supporting Freeman Hospital's Children's Heart Unit.
