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Snowflake Ball Raises Over £24k For Sick Children's Trust

Although The Sick Children's Trust provides accommodation free to families with seriously ill children, it costs the charity £30 to support a family for one night. This amount of money will make a significant difference to the families we support in the North East at our 'Homes from Home' Crawford House and Scott House. We'd like to say a huge thank you to everyone who came, the North East Fundraising Committee and of course The Marriott Hotel for its continued support."
