5. Go on tour in Hawaii

7. Discover Lady Elliott Island

Situated on the very southern tip of the Great Barrier Reef, Lady Elliott Island is a tiny island with world-class diving and snorkelling, and amazing wildlife, including green and loggerhead turtles which nest on the beaches, manta rays and humpback whales.

For the first time in 2016, STA Travel is offering a 'Lady Elliot Island and Fraser Island Experience' which includes two nights in either an eco-hut or en-suite room on Lady Elliot Island, one night in Hervey Bay and 1 night on Fraser Island. It also includes flights from Hervey Bay to Lady Elliot Island and 4WD bus to Fraser Island. Prices from £640 per person.

8. Book an adventure in the Philippines
