As per a report created by Global Market Insights, the waste management market is expected to double itself in a decade. It is time we take responsibility and control this.

In a way it does, but then there is a prescribed way provided by the government that we abide by. There is certain waste that needs to be disposed of and cannot be recycled. This is usually done through an autoclave or high temperature; which contributes the most to the carbon footprint. However, certain categories can be recycled, these caused the lowest carbon footprint.

What is the way forward?

We have undertaken 8-9 projects in a span of 10 months. With all my experience, I believe, being responsible is the only way forward. The hospitals, factories, mills, and any facility which are contributing towards waste of any kind need to be responsible enough to ensure that the waste is disposed of responsibly.
