

# The Search is on for the 2016 Fields in Trust 'Young Champion' outdoor space volunteer

UK charity **Fields in Trust**, in partnership with **Groundwork** is launching a nationwide search for a "Young Champion" to celebrate the amazing work that young people (aged 16-24), are doing to make their communities a greener and happier place to live.

Nominations are open to recognise young people who have volunteered to improve a green space, undertaken conservation work or encouraged others through sports coaching. The Fields In Trust Young Champion Award will celebrate recognise the exemplary work and dedication of a young person working to make their community better by helping people get outside, get active and love where they live.

The winner will be announced at the Fields in Trust Awards at Lord's Cricket Ground on Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup> November and will be following the footsteps of last year's winner, **George Friend** who was recognised for his commitment to campaigning for the refurbishment of Aubrey Meads Play Area, Bristol; a space that is now a fun and safe play-area the whole community can enjoy.

Environmental volunteering charity Groundwork are supporting the Award, **Sarah Reece-Mills**, Groundwork's Director of Partnerships and Programmes said: *"We are delighted to be sponsoring this award to recognise and celebrate the work young people are doing to help preserve their local greenspace. We look forward to seeing all the applications come through and are excited to crown this year's winner in November."*

Fields in Trust Chief Executive **Helen Griffiths** said: *"Overall our awards celebrate the important role played by many organisations and individuals in protecting and improving outdoor space but hearing the stories of our Young Champions is particularly heart-warming.
