UK's Top Comedians Set To Converge On The Lake District For Outdoor Laughs Galore

Some of the UK's top comedians will be swapping the comfort of the stage for the rugged Lakeland landscape as part of Cumbria's biggest comedy festival.

Household names in comedy including Lee Evans, Omid Djalili, Lee Nelson, Arthur Smith and Lucy Porter will be converging on Kendal's Brewery Arts Centre for the annual Freerange Comedy Festival which takes over the town from 12-18 May.

The Freerange Comedy Festival is famous for staging comedy gigs in imaginative outdoor locations in the Lake District and in the four years it has been running has seen shows performed on mountain bikes in Grizedale Forest, on a high wire tree trek on the shores of Windermere, atop the summit of 321m peak Gummer's How and on sea cliff traverse overlooking Morecambe Bay.

This year will see the one of the originators of alternative comedy Arthur Smith lead 30 comedy fans on a five mile comedy ramble along the Western shores of Windermere before performing in the historic National Trust property Wray Castle near Ambleside (Sat 17 May at 1pm).

Another outdoor show will see madcap surrealist Bob Slayer take an audience into the depths of the Langdale Valley before staging a unique comedy club in a spectacular mystery location (Fri 16 May at 6pm). Following the gig, Bob will host an evening of comedy stories at the UK's only National Trust-run pub, The Sticklebarn Tavern at Great Langdale Sat 17 May 7.30pm).

The remainder of the festival will take place at the Brewery Arts Centre in Kendal and includes performances from:
