EMMAUS BRISTOL AND ITS PARTNERSHIP WITH LEGS4AFRICA IN BRISTOL

Bristol, UK: From the start of 2019, Legs4Africa's 'Deliver a Leg' campaign has really taken off. The programme aims to enlist travellers who are already venturing to Africa to use some of their baggage allowance to carry much needed prosthetic equipment to Legs4Africa's partnering mobility centres. Since the campaign began, Emmaus in Bristol has provided Legs4Africa with luggage bags for volunteers to carry the components in. Thanks to Emmaus's generosity, Legs4Africa is able to tailor 'suitcases' with prosthetic leg components for volunteers to check in when they fly.

Legs4Africa is now successfully collecting and recycling over a thousand prosthetic legs a year. However, the challenge has always been of how to get them to where they are needed without costing the charity a lot of money. Most amputees living in Africa are in need of prosthetic legs so they can be active and mobile members of their community and escape the isolation that limb loss can cause. This collaboration between Emmaus Bristol and Legs4Africa shows how a project can be even more effective when two or more charities start working together. It's also a excellent example of how sharing resources can limit waste whilst helping people on another continent.

Charity workers, adventurers or people doing business in Africa are encouraged to become a Leg Deliverer. It's easy, doesn't cost anything and it gets people walking again!
