

VIDEO: BEAR GRYLLS' TALK GOES TERRIBLY AWRY

PETA Supporters Interrupt Presentation to Protest Animal Slaughter on The Island

London – As survivalist Bear Grylls gave a talk at The Royal Institution in London today, a trio of PETA supporters ran onstage brandishing banners protesting the the cruelty to animals which took place during the filming of Grylls' TV show. The protesters confronted *The Island With Bear Grylls* host to let the startled audience know that Grylls' Channel 4 series recently shipped a pig to Panama specifically to have contestants slit her throat. Also, on a previous episode, contestants tracked down and killed an endangered American crocodile, an animal who is protected under the US Endangered Species Act.

These actions come in the midst of a campaign by PETA calling for Channel 4 to <u>implement a comprehensive animal-welfare policy</u>. Video footage of the protest is available <u>here</u>.

"There's nothing entertaining or excusable about shipping an animal overseas to slit her throat and eat her body on camera", says PETA Director Mimi Bekhechi. "PETA is calling on Channel 4 to adopt an animal-welfare policy immediately and make sure that no more animals suffer and die for 'entertainment."

As PETA – whose motto reads, in part, that "animals are not ours to abuse in any way" – has pointed out to Channel 4, had the pig-killing incident taken place in the UK, the contestants could have faced charges and, potentially, time in prison. PETA also notes that torturing and killing animals is a cruel way to attempt to boost ratings and sends an especially harmful message to young viewers, who are greatly influenced by what they see on TV.
