

WBECS becomes 7th signatory of the Global Code of Ethics for Coaches, Mentors, and Supervisors

Monday 22 July, 2019

The Global Code of Ethics supports excellence in the development of coaching, mentoring, and supervision and raises the standards of practice of members. It was created by two professional associations, Association for Coaching ('AC') and European Mentoring and Coaching Council ('EMCC'), in February 2016.

In 2018, four additional professional associations joined this initiative: Association for Professional Executive Coaches and Supervisors ('APECS'), Associazione Italiana Coach Professionisti ('AICP'), and the Mentoring Institute at the University of New Mexico. The International Mentoring Association ('IMA') became the fifth organisation to sign up for the Code in January 2019.

We are very pleased to announce that WBECS decided to sign up the Code on 1 July 2019.

Upon becoming a signatory, Marva Sadler WBECS Group CEO said *'As part of our mission to raise the global standard of coaching, we strongly support coaching partners such as EMCC who are providing ethical practice guidelines for coaches, which help to distinguish professional coaches who are dedicated to continued development in their profession.'*

The current signatories continue invite other world-wide professional bodies in the field, to join this initiative and become organisational signatories.

This code has a wider impact by informing the work of people who may not be members of the signatory bodies but who practice coaching, mentoring, supervision, and training related activities or are sponsors, users, beneficiaries and purchasers of such services, anywhere around the world.
