Malcolm Pyle of Beverley will be taking part in a tandem sky dive on Saturday 7th December 2013 in Bridlington for Pancreatic Cancer Action.

Malcolm, who hopes to raise over £700 by bravely jumping out of a plane from 12,500 feet, said: "I decided to take on this challenge to raise funds for a cause close to my heart. Sadly, my dad died of pancreatic cancer in September 2012. This was just under a year from his diagnosis with the cruel disease."

Alan John Pyle, Malcolm's father, lived in Hailsham, East Sussex. He was a retired policeman that had worked for Hailsham, Eastbourne and Crowborough to name a few. Alan was part of a very close family and was a friend to many.

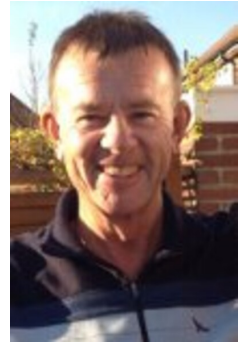
